Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.		
What?	The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:  • Social Security number and income  • Account balances and payment history  • Credit history and transactions history  When you are no longer our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice		
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons Banc of California chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Definitions					
Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. Our affiliates are:  Banc of California, Inc.  Deepstack Technologies, LLC  BofCal Asset Management Inc. (Formerly known as Pacific Western Asset Management Inc.)				
Nonaffiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial service providers or nonfinancial companies or subsequent investors.				
Joint marketing	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. Our joint marketing is with financial service companies.

<u>California Residents</u> – California law requires financial institutions to obtain your consent prior to sharing information about you with non-affiliated third parties, except as permitted by California law.
